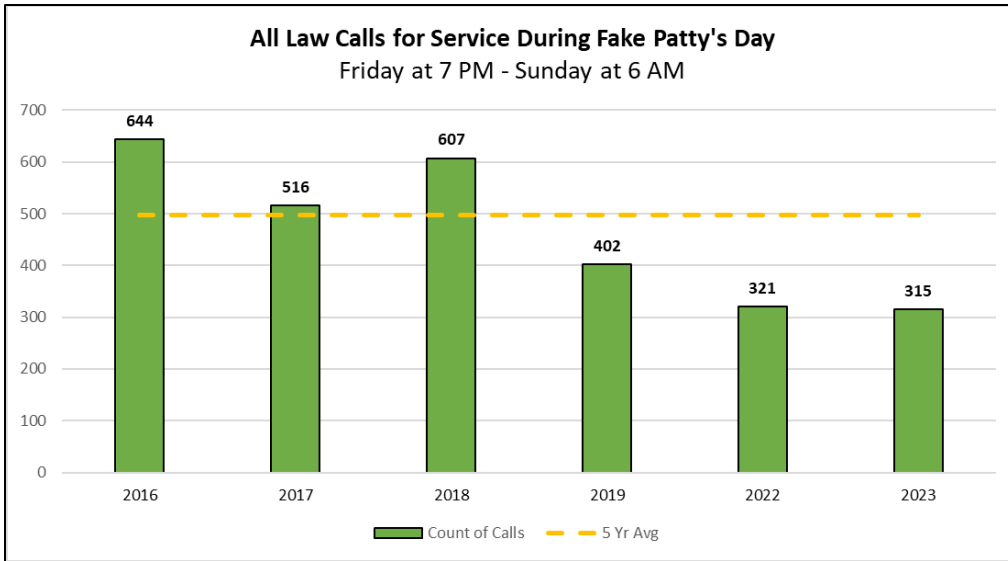


All Calls for Law Enforcement



Law Calls for Service Summary

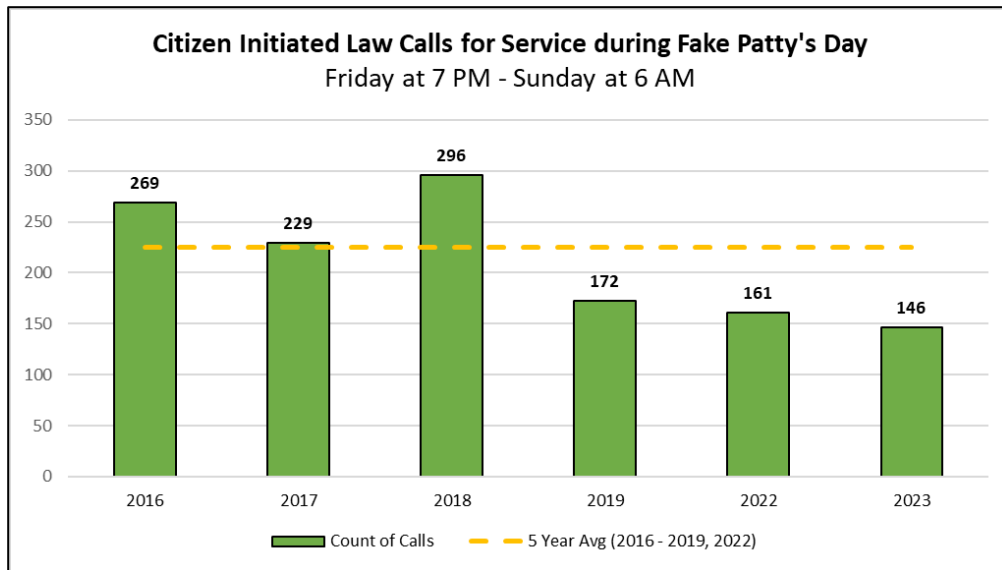
The chart to the left shows the number of calls for service that law enforcement responded to during Fake Patty's Day by year. This includes both officer initiated and citizen initiated calls. The yellow dotted line shows the 5-year average of 498.0 calls for service.

This chart shows that 2023 was well below the 5-year average (down 36.8%). Comparing 2023 to last year there was a 1.9% decrease.

Historically, Traffic Stop was the top call nature during this event followed by Minors in Possession and Welfare Check. In 2023, Traffic Stop was still the top nature followed by Open Container and Welfare Check.

Citizen Initiated Law Calls for Service Summary

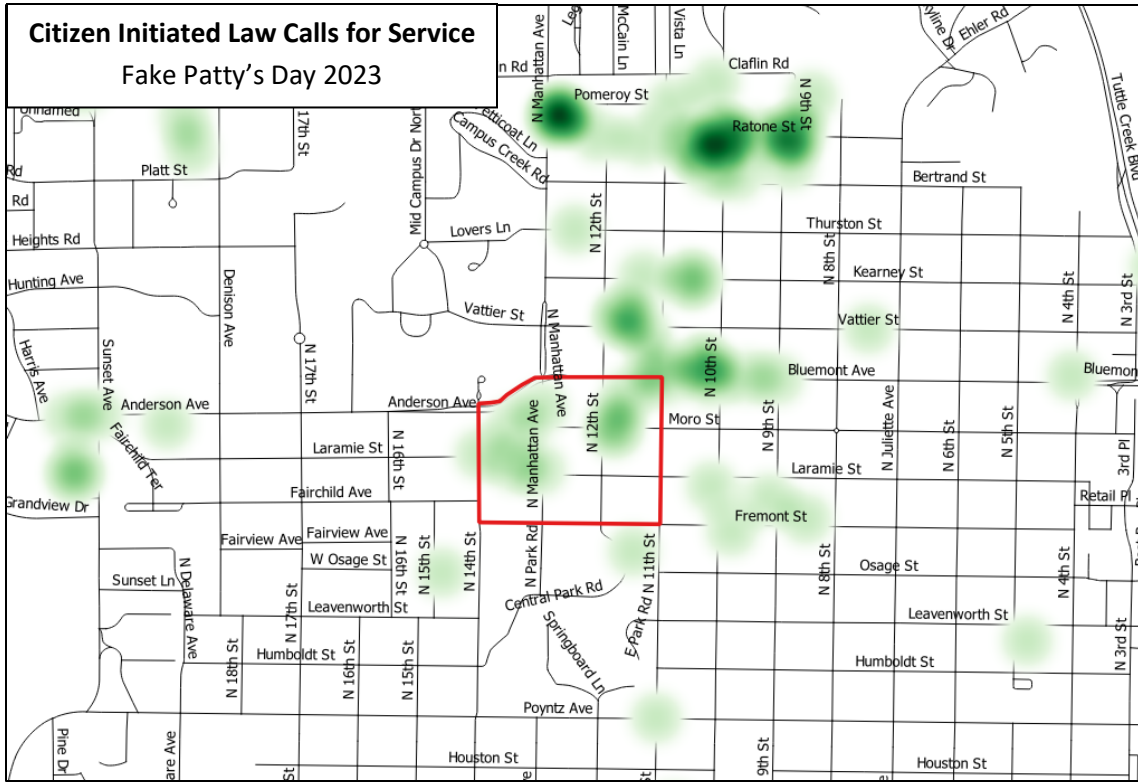
This section focuses on the law calls for service that were received from citizens, so it excludes all officer-initiated calls. The 5-year average for citizen-initiated law calls was 225.4 (displayed as the yellow dashed line on the chart).

2023 had the lowest number of citizen calls during Fake Patty's Day (down 35.2% from the 5-year average). This is a continuing downward trend from the past couple years where there were 172 calls in 2019 and 161 calls in 2022.

Speak with officer, welfare check, unwanted subject, and noise were the top 2023 citizen call natures.

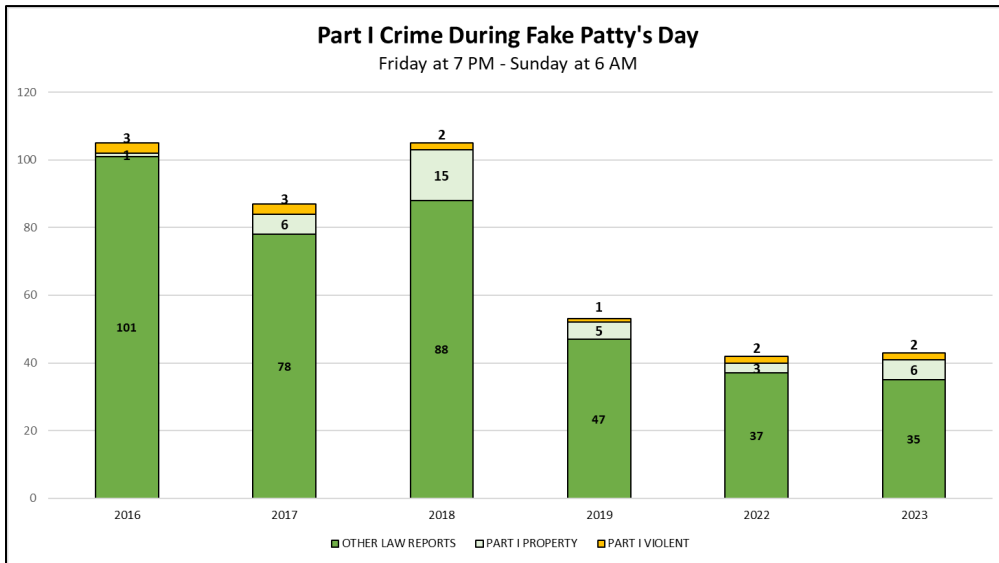

The map shows the hot spots of the citizen-initiated law calls for service in 2023. The red outline shows the Aggieville area. The highest concentration of calls this year came from the 900 – 1200 blocks of Ratone St. Although there is some concentration of calls within Aggieville, the greatest concentrations were in the residential areas outside of the business district.

Reports Filed Excluding Alcohol Violations

This section only accounts for the primary offense of the report. This data pull does not include alcohol violations.



Reports Filed Summary

This section shows the number of reports filed by year and type of report (Part I Violent, Part I Property, or Other). It only includes the primary offense of the report and alcohol offenses are not counted in this section.

As shown on the chart, 2023 had the second lowest number of total reports filed during Fake Patty's Day, one more than 2022. Compared to the 5-year average (78.4 reports filed), 2023 was down 45.2%.

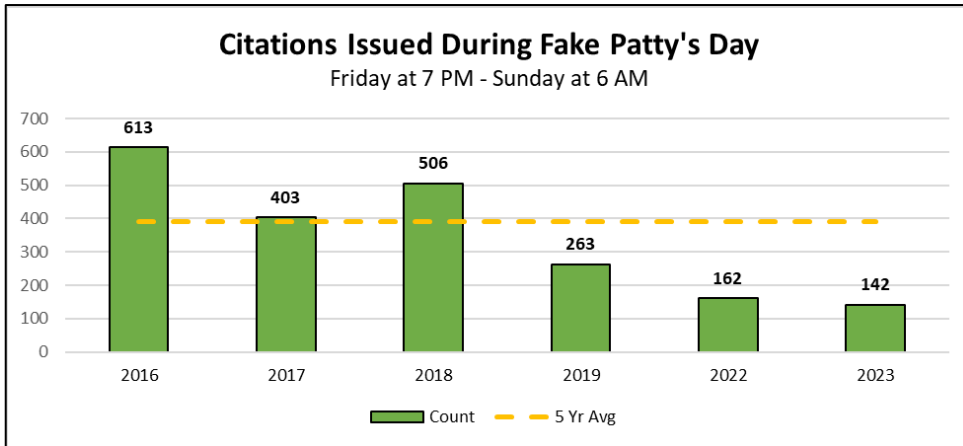

The top 5 offenses in 2023 during Fake Patty's Day were found property, DUI, battery-simple, CDP, and larceny-all other.

Citations

This section counts the number of citations that were issued during Fake Patty's Day by year. This includes traffic, parking, misdemeanor, and ordinance citations.



Citations Summary

Looking at the number of citations issued during Fake Patty's Day, 2023 had the lowest number (63.5% below the average of 389.4) and is consistent with a continuing trend downward of citations since 2019. This is due to the change in patrol strategy regarding Fake Patty's Day enforcement.

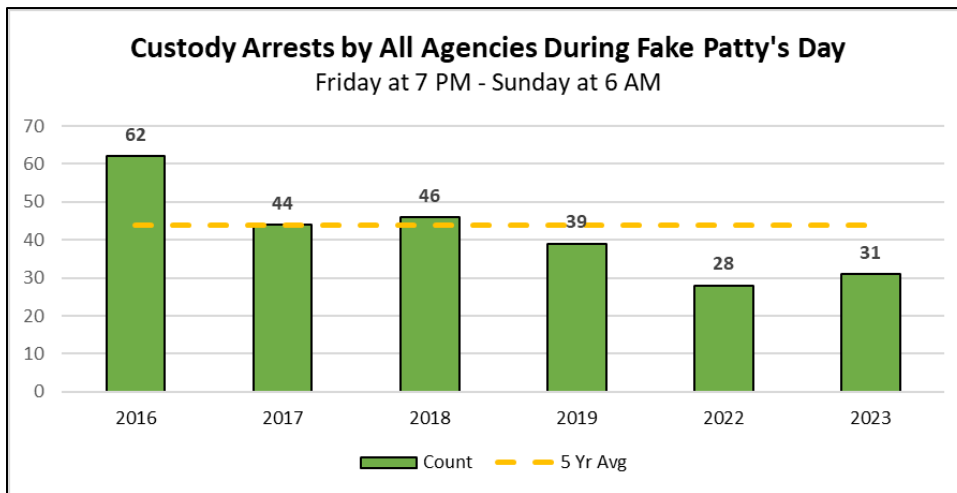
For citation offenses, historically possession of open container in public was the most cited. In 2023, the top offense was not consistent with past years. The offense of permit required – yellow/green/red topped the list for 2023 with 27 citations. This was followed by possession or consumption by a minor, stop / stand prohibited in certain places, then possession of open container in public.

Custody Arrests – All Agencies

This section shows the number of custody arrests that were made during the Fake Patty's Day time by all agencies. This includes the agencies RCPD, Kansas Highway Patrol, and Kansas State University Police who had a larger part of enforcement during Fake Patty's Day in prior years.



Arrest Summary

2023 had the second fewest arrests made during Fake Patty's Day (29.2% decrease compared to the average of 43.8). 2022 had the fewest arrest with 28.

DUI, which is historically a top arresting offense, was the most in 2023 with 16 total arrests followed by traffic-other violation and possession of drugs. There were only 2 disorderly conduct arrests in 2023. Disorderly conduct was historically one of the top offenses.
